The city has since grown from a pueblo to one of the largest international business hubs in the world, a thriving metropolis and home to 4 million people. Currently, LADWP is leading an effort to expand our local water supplies and reduce our reliance on imported water. But the importance of the L.A. Aqueduct will remain, and we celebrate its enduring legacy that helped Los Angeles grow to become the second largest city in the U.S.A.


