

Empowerment Congress Central Area Neighborhood Development Council (ECCANDC) Ballot Voting Model

The ECCANDC Ballot Voting Model has four (4) ballot types. Stakeholders can only claim one (1) stakeholder status and will be issued one (1) ballot.

AREA 1 REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, attend school/church, own a business/property within the Area 1 boundaries and who are 16 years or older can vote for the following races:

- Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Co-Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Secretary - Vote for one (1)
- Stakeholder Associate Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Area 1 Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)

AREA 2 REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, attend school/church, own a business/property within the Area 2 boundaries and who are 16 years or older can vote for the following races:

- Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Co-Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Secretary - Vote for one (1)
- Stakeholder Associate Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Area 2 Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)

AREA 3 REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, attend school/church, own a business/property within the Area 3 boundaries and who are 16 years or older can vote for the following races:

- Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Co-Chairperson - Vote for one (1)
- Secretary - Vote for one (1)
- Stakeholder Associate Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Area 3 Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)

COMMUNITY INTEREST BALLOT

Stakeholders who declare a stake within the ECCANDC boundaries as a community interest stakeholder and affirm a substantial and ongoing participation within neighborhood boundaries and who are 16 years or older can vote for the following races:

- Stakeholder Associate Representative - Vote for one (1)

Summary:

- The ECCANDC has 20 board seats. **Ten (10)** are elected.
- Stakeholders will use **documentation** as a means of establishing their stakeholder status.
- Minimum stakeholder voting age is **16**.
- The ECCANDC Board has a two-year term.
- Candidates can run for no more than one Board seat.
