

# Encino Neighborhood Council (ENC) Ballot Voting Model

---

The ENC Ballot Voting Model has eight (8) ballot types. Stakeholders can only claim one (1) stakeholder status and will be issued one (1) ballot.

## 1) ENC BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property or who declare a stake in the neighborhood and affirm the factual basis for it and who are 18 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Apartment/Condo Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Business Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Education Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Park Advocate/Environment Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Planning and Land Use Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Public Safety Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Religious Organization/Institution Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Volunteer/Service Representative - Vote for one (1)

## 2) AREA 1 BALLOT

Stakeholders who are residents of Area 1 and who are 18 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Area 1 Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Apartment/Condo Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Business Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Education Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Park Advocate/Environment Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Planning and Land Use Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Public Safety Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Religious Organization/Institution Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Volunteer/Service Representative - Vote for one (1)

- Business Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Education Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Park Advocate/Environment Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Planning and Land Use Representative - Vote for one (1)

- Public Safety Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Religious Organization/Institution Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Volunteer/Service Representative - Vote for one (1)

## 8) AREA 7 BALLOT

Stakeholders who are residents of Area 7 and who are 18 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Area 7 Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Apartment/Condo Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Business Representatives - Vote for up to two (2)
- Education Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Park Advocate/Environment Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Planning and Land Use Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Public Safety Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Religious Organization/Institution Representative - Vote for one (1)
- Volunteer/Service Representative - Vote for one (1)

### Summary:

- The ENC has 21 board seats. Only **18** are elected.
- Stakeholders will use **documentation** as a means of establishing their stakeholder status.
- Minimum stakeholder voting age is **18**.
- The ENC has seven (7) residential areas.
- The ENC Board has a two-year term.
