Historic Cultural Neighborhood Council (HCNC) Ballot Voting Model

The HCNC Ballot Voting Model has seven (7) ballots. Stakeholders can only claim one (1) stakeholder status and be issued one (1) ballot.

1) GENERAL BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work or own real property in the neighborhood and also those who declare a stake in the neighborhood as a community interest stakeholder, defined as a person who affirms a substantial and ongoing participation within the neighborhood council's boundaries and who may be in a community organization such as, but not limited to, educational, non-profit and/or religious organizations, and who are 15 years old can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)

2) ARTS DISTRICT BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) within the Arts District and who are 15 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- Arts District Resident Representative Vote for one (1)
- Arts District Business Owner Representative Vote for one (1)

3) CHINATOWN BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) within Chinatown and who are 15 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- Chinatown Resident Representative Vote for up to two (2)
- Chinatown Business Owner Representative Vote for one (1)

4) EL PUEBLO DE LOS ANGELES BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) within the El Pueblo De Los Angeles and who are 15 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- El Pueblo de Los Angeles At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- El Pueblo de Los Angeles Business Owner Representative Vote for one (1)

5) LITTLE TOKYO BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) within the Little Tokyo and who are 15 years or older can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- Little Tokyo Resident Representative Vote for one (1)
- Little Tokyo Nonprofit Representative Vote for one (1)

6) SOLANO CANYON BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) in the Solano Canyon geographical area can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- Solano Canyon Resident Representative Vote for one (1)
- Solano Canyon Nonprofit Representative Vote for one (1)

7) VICTOR HEIGHTS BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work, own property, own a business or participate in non-profit groups, schools, associations and organizations (and can provide an exact address) in the Victor Heights geographical area can vote for the following races:

- At-Large Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Employee Representative of Business Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Commercial Property Owner Representative Vote for one (1)
- At-Large Senior Representative Vote for one (1)
- Victor Heights Resident Representative Vote for up to two (2)

Summary:

- The HCNC has 33 Board seats. All **33** are elected, but only **17** will be up for election due to staggered board terms.
- Stakeholders will use **documentation** as a means of establishing their stakeholder status.
- Minimum stakeholder voting age is **15**.
- The HCNC Board has a staggered, four-year term.
- Candidates can run for no more than one Board seat.
