



A SERVICE INITIATIVE TO COORDINATE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT EVENTS ACROSS LOS ANGELES

Los Angeles' greatest resource is its people—the creative, passionate, and forward thinking individuals who turn away from the status-quo and focus on what's possible if we work together. Whether you are passionate about helping to end veteran homelessness or planting trees in neighborhoods that need them most, there's a place for you in the Volunteer Corps.

The Mayor's Volunteer Corps is divided into several specialty corps to address different needs in Los Angeles. Each has event programming focused on addressing a particular community concern. The five corps groups are:

CLEAN STREETS LA

We attend Clean Streets volunteer events, such as neighborhood clean-ups with the Office of Community Beautification, MyLA311 reporting sweeps, and educational outreach for residents and business owners. Find out more at cleanstreetsla.org.

SUSTAINABILITY CORPS

We are creating a Los Angeles that is environmentally healthy, economically prosperous, and equitable in opportunity for all. Our Sustainability Corps supports our Save the Drop campaign, CicLAvia and "Play Streets" events, tree plantings, waterway cleanups, parkway and median improvements, our efforts to increase access to healthy, affordable food, and much more.

CITIZENSHIP CORPS

We work with various community stakeholders to support immigrant integration into the City of Los Angeles. Our Citizenship Corps assists staff during events that help educate immigrant communities on various programs. Opportunities and events include application assistance workshops, education forums, and resource fairs that take place throughout the City. Multi-lingual volunteers and those with some legal expertise are highly encouraged to join us.

VETERANS CORPS

We assist non-profit and community based partners in engaging with veterans seeking housing, employment, medical benefits, and mental health services. Los Angeles is home to the highest concentration of military veterans, with an estimated 500-750 homeless veterans in the County who are not connected to any supportive services. With the assistance of our amazing volunteers, we hope to bring that number down to zero. All over the City, agencies in the L.A. Continuum of Care host coordinated outreach events, as well as train volunteers on how to most effectively outreach to homeless veterans and link them to important services.

ENDING HOMELESSNESS CORPS

We understand the urgency of the homelessness crisis in Los Angeles and that's why we sign up to be Shelter Hospitality Volunteers, join outreach teams, and empower people with the skills needed to advance their search for housing and employment. Volunteers work with experienced staff and service providers at various organizations to help increase their capacity.
