



## LOS ANGELES REGION

- Between 2010 and 2030, the older adult population in the Los Angeles region is expected to almost double, from approximately 1.1 million to more than 2.1 million individuals.
- The trend is for the greatest growth to occur in the oldest age groups.
- The older adult population is becoming more racially and ethnically diverse than ever before.

Los Angeles County is home to one of the world's largest concentrations of older adults.

Our population is larger than that of the older adult populations of 40 states.

  - Two designated Area Agencies on Aging

#### **PROCESS**

- A designation process established by the World Health Organization to help assess readiness for an aging population and create a supportive network for this work.
- In U.S. AARP is the national entity that supports the initiative.
- Seeking designation requires commitment from highest elected official to engage in an assessment, planning, implementation, and evaluation process taking place over a five year period.
