Every person wishing to address the Commission must dial (669) 900-9128, and enter

820 4187 5556 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the Chair or designee to provide public input at the meeting, the public will be requested to dial \*9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Commission.

The amount of time for public comment on each agenda item is to be determined by the Chair at each meeting. Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item.

A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit his or her remarks to a total of five (5) minutes per meeting. Members of the public who want to speak on multiple agenda items for up to five (5) minutes at one time can choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items Comment period. Members of the public who choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items period will be given the opportunity to also speak during General Public Comment.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment, unless the presiding officer of the Board decides differently.

<u>Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statements and Resolutions</u> Pursuant to Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 22.819, a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution. If the Neighborhood Council would like to be heard on its CIS or resolution at a Commission meeting, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or Resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website.

If the CIS or Resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative will have an opportunity to present the

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Neighborhood Council's formal position. In the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. If the CIS or Resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council Representative may speak during General Public Comments.

As a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, the City of Los Angeles does not discriminate on the basis of disability and upon request will provide reasonable accommodation to ensure equal access to its programs, services, and activities. Sign language interpreters, assisted listening devices, or other auxiliary aids and/or services may be provided upon request. 6. [6:27 PM] Findings to Continue Teleconference Meetings Pursuant to AB 361 [Government Code Section 54953(e)]. Determination in accordance with AB 361 [Government Code Section 54953(e)(3)] that, while the state of emergency due to the Covid-19 pandemic, as originally proclaimed by the Governor on March 4, 2020, remains active and state or local officials have imposed recommended measures to promote social distancing, this legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and that the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the Commission and neighborhood council board and committee members to meet safely in person and state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

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### 7. [6:37 PM] General Manager's Verbal Report.

Department Administration, Neighborhood Council engagement, civic leadership, innovation, policy and government, staffing, awareness and engagement, EmpowerLA Virtual Governance (EVG) Hybrid Working group, budget, City policies, and exhaustive efforts.

D.O.N.E. Representative: General Manager Raquel Beltran.

GM Beltran began her report by providing introductions on new hires, as follows: <u>Blair Benmoin</u>, the Department's new Executive Administrative Assistant. Blair Benmoin said hello. <u>Alfonso Manzo</u> is the new Inclusive Engagement Advocate (IEA), under the supervision of Angie Aramayo. Alfonso shared a few thoughts.

<u>Henry Lo</u> is filling a management analyst position and will be overseeing Personnel & Human Resources. Henry answered some questions by GM Beltran as to his efforts.

GM Raquel Beltran introduced <u>Mario Gomez</u>, under agenda item #9; however, he had left the meeting. GM Beltran noted that they are still hiring a Commission Executive Assistant who will work under Thomas Soong, who is on vacation this week.

General Manager Beltran provided detailed comments and updates on a variety of items, including but not limited to several council files that they have or are in the process of doing reports on:

**Council File # 22-1070,** "Neighborhood Council Meetings / EmpowerLA Virtual Governance (EVG) System / In-Person / Emergency Declarations" asks for a report on issues associated with Empowered Virtual Governance, and noted that they have sent a list of questions to the City Attorney's office, including getting confirmation the timing of the lifting of the City's Declaration of Emergency related to COVID and the Governor's, and whether in-person meeting starts February 1<sup>st</sup> or March 1<sup>st</sup>. GM Beltran noted that they folded in recommendations for the Mayor's consideration as to proposing amendments to the Brown Act. Some include asking that the State give the City Council the authority to make certain level decisions as to the Brown Act for NCs, to consider exemptions, at least exempting NC committees from returning in person, and allowing NCs to meet virtually only for committees. She noted that the committees are not ready, for one reason, their physical locations cannot be inspected, and that the City Clerk's part of the process has yet to be taken into consideration. She noted that hybrid meetings would follow very restricted terms that AB 2449 allows as to hybrid meetings, and that they have begun to have conversations with City vendors to provide technical support, as to logistics, quotes, folded into their report for CF# 22-1070. They are seeking financial support, resources from the City Council to administer hybrid meetings for the 14 neighborhood councils, and are exploring what is in the Brown Act as to a phone line available for public comment, as an option as a 3<sup>rd</sup> way to hold meetings in person, hybrid or in person with telephone call-ins.

GM Beltran noted that the report for **Council File # 11-1020-S3** "<u>Neighborhood Council Funding Program / Budget</u> <u>Advocates / Term Substitution / Budget Advocacy / Los Angeles Administrative Code / Amendment</u>" related to the ordinance amendment returning the language from Budget Advocates to Budget Advocacy, has been written and uploaded to the council file for comment.

She noted that the report is complete for **Council File # 20-0990** "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Training / Anti-<u>Bias Training / Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Members</u>" that speaks to mandatory training, mandating that anti-bias training be available to city employees, and noted that would be a mandatory training if approved.

GM Beltran related that as to Awareness & Engagement regarding elections, they have finished securing a contract with KPCC who will begin to run radio ads today, and starting tomorrow, radio ads on KJLA. They'll run for a couple weeks intermittently. Last week Channel 35 uploaded a recording that they did at This Week LA. Go to the website and share the material to promote the NC system. The General Manager provided a variety of data updates. She is making herself available to attend NC meetings.

### FINALIZATION OF BOARD ACTION:

Per City Charter Section 245, the Board's determination shall become final at the expiration of the next five meeting days of the Council during which the City Council has convened in regular session, unless the City Council acts within that timeframe by a two-thirds vote to bring the action before them or to waive review of the action.

#### **EXHAUSTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES:**

If you challenge these agenda items in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing or in written correspondence on these matters delivered to this agency at or prior to the public hearing. California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6 governs the

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time in which a party may seek judicial review of this determination. Under that provision, a petitioner may seek judicial review of any decision of the City pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.5 only if the petition for Writ of Mandate pursuant to that section is filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which the City's decision became final.

### **RECONSIDERATION:**

The Commission may make a MOTION TO RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on any item listed on this agenda at any time during this meeting, or make a MOTION TO RECONSIDER at its next regular meeting as indicated below:

If the Commission moves and approves a Motion for Reconsideration at the *initial* meeting wherein an action was taken, then the underlying item may be reconsidered at that time.

If the Commission moves and approves a Motion for Reconsideration at *the next regular meeting* then consideration of the item may *only* occur at this regularly scheduled meeting if the item for consideration has been placed on that meeting's agenda. If the underlying item for reconsideration has not been placed on the agenda for that next regular meeting, then it shall be considered at a subsequent meeting pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.
